Annual Recruitment for Commission Openings

The city is beginning its annual recruitment process to fill upcoming openings on four city commissions and one joint city commission. Applications for the annual appointment process will be accepted through January 20, 2007. Applications are available on the city's website www.brooklynpark.org, or at the City Hall customer service desk. You may also call 763.493.8001 to request an application or to get additional information on the commissions.

The only prerequisite necessary to serve on one of the city's commissions is to have a commitment to building a strong, vibrant community. Recruiting is currently taking place for the following commissions:

Citizen Long-Range Improvement Commission (CLIC)

The CLIC studies all improvements concerning the present and future needs and requirements of the city where public funds and/or collected fees are involved. This committee helps to set direction and goals for the city. Meetings are held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 7 p.m.

Human Relations Commission (HRC)

The HRC seeks to ensure equal opportunity in employment, housing, public accommodations, public services and education for residents of the city. This commission assists the Minnesota Department of Human Rights in implementing state laws against discrimination and advises the City Council on long-range programs to ensure that human service needs

are met. This group, charged with promoting diversity within Brooklyn Park and City Hall, meets every third Thursday of the month at 7 p.m.

Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission

This advisory commission studies issues relative to public parks and recreation within the city. This commission meets every third Wednesday of the month at 7 p.m.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission holds public hearings on a wide variety of development issues including zoning, platting, conditional use permits and variance. In addition, this group develops long-range plans to guide the physical development of the community through a comprehensive planning process. This commission meets every second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 7 p.m.

Northwest Suburbs

Cable Communications Commission

This commission is the regulatory agency for the cable franchise for the nine northwest suburbs in the commission (Brooklyn Park, Brooklyn Center, Crystal, Golden Valley, Maple Grove, New Hope, Osseo, Plymouth and Robbinsdale). The group meets every third Thursday of the month starting at 7:30 a.m.

Winters in Minnesota can get down right ugly. To better prepare residents for the icy roads, thefts, snow storms and accidents that sometimes occur during the winter months, the City of Brooklyn Park offers the following advice:

Winter Car Theft

Many times living in Minnesota requires residents to warm up their vehicles before driving to their destination. However, be careful not to leave your vehicle running unattended. In a recent national survey, over 30% of stolen vehicles had keys left in the ignition. In many of those cases, cars were left running while the drivers waited inside the house, paid for gas, etc. Always remember to stay with your vehicle when warming up the car or lock the doors if you need to leave your keys in the ignition (assuming you can still unlock the doors to get back in). Always keep your car in sight—thieves are still capable of breaking car windows.

Winter Survival Kits for your Vehicle

The following is a recipe for safety when traveling by vehicle:

Take a three-pound coffee can and fill it with candle stubs and matches (which can be used to melt snow for additional drinking water). Add:

- One metal cup
- Red bandanna and a plastic whistle
(to alert rescuers to your location)
- Pencil and paper, and change for phone calls
- First aid kit including any essential medications
- Plastic flashlight with spare batteries
- Two large plastic garbage bags, safety pins
(bags are for insulation for feet, safety pins will keep the bags together)
- Bottled water and snack food for energy, such as candy bars

Some other items that you should have in your car include:

- an extra set of dry clothing
- a snowmobile suit
- gloves or mittens
- winter boots
- blankets and/or sleeping bag
- jumper cables
- a basic toolbox
- a shovel
- a bag of sand or other grit for traction
- tow cables or chain
- road flares and reflectors
- cell phone

Whenever traveling in the winter, call ahead to your destination and convey when you intend to leave, what travel route you will take and your expected time of arrival. If you are stranded, never leave your vehicle; staying with your vehicle greatly increases your chances of survival.

Lower Your Risk of Car Theft!

Your chance of becoming a victim of car theft is:

1 in 30

If you leave your car unlocked, leave your keys in the ignition, or leave your valuables in plain view

1 in 1,000

If you lock your car, take your keys, and conceal your valuables

1 in 30,000

If you lock your car, take your keys, conceal your valuables, and use a visible anti-theft device



Winter & Holiday Safety Guide

Stay Safe this Holiday Season

Criminals love the holidays as much as everyone else as they provide a perfect opportunity to commit a crime. For a safe and happy holiday season, remember to keep these tips in mind:

When traveling...

- Set an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask your neighbor to watch your home, shovel the walks, pick up newspapers, collect mail, and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Be sure to hide any gifts that may be left in the house while you are gone.

When you are out for the evening...

- Turn on lights and a radio or the TV so that it appears that someone is home.
- Lock all doors and windows while you are out, even if you will only be gone a few minutes.
- Do not place packages or gifts near windows or in other high-visibility sites.

When shopping...

- Don't let your guard down just because you are rushing.
- Stay alert and be aware of everything around you at all times.
- Park in well-lighted spaces and as close to the store as possible, lock your car doors, and hide packages in the truck or under seats.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash; pay with a credit card if possible.
- Make sure that you do not carry all your packages at the same time.
- Carry your purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.
- If you take your children shopping, teach them to go to a police officer or a store security guard if they get separated or get lost.

When a stranger comes to your door...

- Stay alert to suspicious-looking couriers delivering packages to you or your neighbors.
- Many con artists take advantage of holiday generosity by going door-to-door. Ask for identification and get specifics to how and where the donations will be used.
- If you feel uncomfortable, just say "no thank you" and shut the door.

When you are at home...

- Turn on outside lights to deter burglars.
- Report any suspicious behavior to the police.
- Make sure your homeowners (or renters) insurance is up-to-date and everything is inventoried properly.

Comprehensive Plan Update Meetings

The updated plans are then reviewed by the Metropolitan Council, the regional planning agency that serves the Twin Cities' seven-county metropolitan area.

Operations & Maintenance

Snow Removal

City streets are usually cleared within 24 hours of a two to six inch snowfall. Note that parking is prohibited on city streets October 15 to April 15 from 2 a.m. to 5 a.m. and after a snowfall of two inches or more until the street is plowed curb to curb. Residents who do not adhere to these guidelines may find their vehicles towed. In the event of a towed vehicle, please call the Police department at 763.493.8222 for instructions on getting your vehicle.

The city also plows snow on City Council designated arterial sidewalks. All other sidewalk snow removal is the responsibility of the property owner adjacent to the sidewalk. When the snowplows are out, remember to give them and the maintenance vehicles plenty of room to do their job. Maintaining safe distances and weather-appropriate speeds helps everyone go about things faster in the long run and makes for a safer winter.

Winter Ice Safety

Did you know that 65% of all ice drownings are vehicle related? Did you know that 70% of the body's heat is lost through your head if unprotected? Did you know that hypothermia and frostbite can become life or limb-threatening in just a few minutes?

With winter weather and changing temperatures approaching, parents, children and sportspeople must be careful before venturing onto frozen lakes and ponds. Remember that even "safe ice" can change quickly with rising temperatures and current and to be careful before driving any vehicle, four-wheeler or snowmobile onto frozen lakes or rivers. Always wear a warm hat to retain body heat and keep an eye on children who are close to open water and ice-covered ponds or streams; it is important to warn children of the dangers that can occur. When venturing on to the ice remember:

- Never walk on ice less than four inches thick.
- Never snowmobile on ice less than five inches thick.
- Never drive a vehicle on ice less than eight inches of new, clear ice.
- Avoid drinking alcoholic beverages when operating a snowmobile.
- Take a snowmobile course offered by the Department of Natural Resources.

Recycling Carts: Bigger, Smaller, Broken...

Is your recycling cart broken? Do you need a bigger or smaller cart? Recycling carts are available in 35, 64, or 96-gallon varieties. The cart dimensions are as follows:

<u>Cart Size</u>	<u>Height</u>	<u>Footprint</u>
35-gallon	37.5 inches	24 x 19 inches
64-gallon	41.5 inches	24 x 27 inches
96-gallon	46 inches	26 x 34.5 inches

Yard Waste Disposal

Don't let this happen to you (snowbound picture to the left). Bring your yard waste to the Maple Grove Yard Waste Site before the (significant) snow starts to fall. The site accepts leaves, grass, and tree branches up to 10 inches in diameter. Brooklyn Park residents can drop off their yard waste free of charge as the facility is funded through resident recycling fees. For more information call 763.420.4886.

Utility Tips

Sewer Odors

During the winter months, dry inside air may cause floor drains to dry out and allow sewer odors to enter your house. To avoid this, occasionally pour a bucket of water into your floor drain in the basement or lowest level of your home.

Freezing Pipes

Cold weather may cause pipes to freeze. It is a good idea to check the water supply meter area in your home to make sure its temperature is kept above freezing during the periods of cold weather.
